The Liturgy of Remembrance

P Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the source of all mercy and the God of all consolation. He comforts us in all our sorrows so that we can comfort others in their sorrows with the consolation we ourselves have received from God.

C Thanks be to God!

P When we were baptized in Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we, too, might live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

P Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ²And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. ALL SAINTS BANNER

The All Saints Banner reminds us of the Saints of God who have died in Christ and now receive the gift of resurrection and eternal life. These Saints have passed on to us their legacy of faith in Christ Jesus. The banner was originally constructed as part of the 225th anniversary of our congregation. The names of the persons buried in the Christ Lutheran Cemetery were written onto the ribbons. Names of members who pass away will be added to the ribbons.

The support of the banner is in the form of a cross. The cross is the means by which Christ has reconciled all of creation both in and on earth to God. By his death on the cross, Jesus has destroyed the powers of sin, evil and death. In baptism, we are marked as saints of God by the sign of the cross. It is a gift of grace that God claims us as sons and daughters and heirs of the kingdom of heaven.

The names which are printed on the ribbon remind us that Jesus the Good Shepherd calls us each by name. We hear his voice and we follow him. By virtue of our baptism, our names have been written into the Book of Life.

The flowing ribbons remind us of the movement of the Holy Spirit in the world and in our lives. In our lives, the Holy Spirit blesses us with the gift of faith. Faith is our trust in God's love for us and God's promise of eternal life. In the world, the Holy Spirit blows like the wind. The Holy Spirit calls, gathers and enlightens the Communion of Saints, the church. In and through this community of faith, the Good News of Jesus Christ is proclaimed in Word and Sacrament. The Holy Spirit keeps the church true in its faith.

The chimes on each end of the cross arms call our attention to the great joy of the Saints gathered around the throne of Christ singing out the Lord's praise. We join our voices with the Saints of old as we

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sing God's praise in worship. We join the Saints who have gone before around the Lord's Table as we receive a foretaste of the feast to come; as the Saints in heaven take eternal delight in the wedding feast that has no end.

By the power of the Holy Spirit, embraced by God's love, meeting of the Resurrected Lord Jesus in Holy Communion we are united with those who have gone before. We are inspired by their faith, which has been passed on to us. And we are given comfort, hope and peace for living each day that is before us.
