- Did you know? According to the National Intimate Partner and Sexual Violence Survey, in Kentucky, more than 1 in 3 women (37.5%) and nearly 1 in 3 men (31%) have been victims of intimate partner violence. In Indiana, approximately 2 in 5 women (40.4%) and more than 1 in 4 men (26.8%) have been victims of intimate partner violence. The Social Ministry Team and Busy Women's Bible Study invite you to join the March donation drive. The group will be collecting all sorts of health and personal hygiene items for The Center for Women and Families to support domestic violence survivors.
