



"When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and

said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." (John 20:19-23)

The first Easter apparently was not as joyful as our Easter celebration. In fact, it was a horrifying moment or even week for the disciples beginning on the night of his betrayal, his trials, crucifixion and death. It was just too much for them to process and make sense of. They were overwhelmed with fear; fear that they would face the same fate as their teacher and master had. That fear forced them to hide behind the locked doors of the house.

When he greets them the first time, he shows them his hands and his side to prove them that indeed; he has risen from the death. The second time, his greetings is followed with a commission and authority; "as the Father has sent me, so I send you… receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

Likewise, in spite of the fact that we celebrated a joyful Easter, but it seems like the 'Good Friday' is still lingering around us. We are still filled with fear of any kinds. I don't know what kind of fear you are facing right now in your life; whether with illness, conflicts within the family and work place, economics uncertainty, war or political instability in our world or whatever fear that might be. Like the disciples, fear often times paralyzes our lives and forces us to shut down and hide ourselves in a locked room of our own confinement. But the good news of Easter for us is, in the midst of our fear and confinement; the risen Christ can come in with and without our invitation and greet us with peace. God grants us peace that passes all understanding, peace that the world cannot give. His peace sets us free from our fear, doubt and confinement. When fear is banished, joy fills our hearts.

Not only does God set us free from our fear and confinement, but also God breathes on us his Holy Spirit and makes us a new creation; just like God breathed on Adam the breath of life and made him a living being. With the power of the Holy Spirit He sends us forth into the world to proclaim the good news of his resurrection and grants us power even to forgive the sins of any as God has forgiven us. Christ is Risen, He is Risen indeed, Alleluia!

HANNAH LIMBONG'S TRAJECTORY



Hannah Limbong, a member of Christ Lutheran Church in Jeffersontown, Kentucky, is musical, leads well, has a willing spirit, and an infectious smile. As a first-year student in high school, Hannah was feeling a bit lost and wasn't really sure about her purpose in life. She was searching.

Hannah became friends with Maddie Engelau through synod youth ministry events. Maddie attended the ELCA Youth Leadership Summit, and afterwards she shared with Hannah how transformative the experience was for her. Maddie shared that it strengthened her faith and got her more involved in the church.

When Pastor Dan Fugate invited Hannah as one of the two synod participants to the upcoming Summit, she was open to the experience and accepted the invitation because of what Maddie had shared with her. However, Hannah didn't have any expectations that she would have the same experience as Maddie.

"Although it sounds like a cliche," Hannah said, "attending the Summit really was life-changing. I felt the presence of God and how God is working through us and through our church. I've always been involved in our congregation, but never on this scale. I wasn't aware of all the ways the ELCA is actively responding to things that are happening in the world."

Hannah says seeing youth lead the Summit inspired her to know that she, too, could be a leader in the church. As a result of her experience at the Summit, Hannah applied to be part of the ELCA Youth Core Leadership Team, a group of high school leaders who plan each year's Summit. Hannah was chosen to be part of the team for two years. "Being part of the Core Leadership Team changed the trajectory of my high school career and of my life really." Hannah added, "Through this service, I learned a lot about myself. I learned what it means to be a servant leader."

Hannah, now a senior in high school, says she has grown as a person and has picked up skills that will benefit her throughout her entire life. Hannah was elected at the 2021 IK Synod Assembly as a voting member to the 2022 Churchwide Assembly. "I can't form the words to express how grateful I am for the experiences I have had. I am amazed at God's miraculous work in small ways at the synod level, national level, and global level. Thank you to all who contributed money or hygiene items for the Center for Women and Families. Your generosity will go a long way in helping women and families as they move out of abusive situations.

Monetary gifts totaled \$779.00, and a check was written and delivered to the Center. A total of 285 hygiene items were collected including 1 bottle/package each of antacids, antibiotic ointment, laxatives, hand sanitizer, Q-tips, baby wipes, facial wipes, and wet wipes; 2 packages each of gauze bandage pads, mouth wash, pain reliver, and vitamins; 3 bottles/packages each of body powder, dental floss sticks, hair styling gel, and hair ties; 4 each of baby lotion, pill organizers, liquid hand soap, and sunscreen: 5 each of baby shampoo, panty liners, kids paint soap, and tampons, 6 bottles hair conditioner and shaving gel, 7 hair brushes, 8 packages of band-aids, 9 bottles of lotion, 11 bottles of hair shampoo, 13 tubes of lip balm, 18 deodorants, 19 razors, 23 bars of soap, 28 bottles of body wash, 32 toothpaste, and 41 toothbrushes.

This project was jointly sponsored by the Social Ministry Committee and the Busy Women's Bible Study group.

BLANKET MAKING PARTY...MARK YOUR CALENDARS

"My Very Own Blanket" is an organization that encourages individuals and groups to make blankets (knit, crochet, quilt, or no-sew fleece) to give to kids in the foster care system. The blankets get a tag with the child's name. Oftentimes, these children have very little that they can call their own. Having a blanket with their name means the child can always take the blanket with them.

The social ministry committee, WELCA, and the Busy Women's Bible Study group will be sponsoring a blanket-making event on Sunday, June 6, after church. We have been approved for a Thrivent grant to help with purchasing materials. We will be making no-sew fleece blankets that get fringed (with knots) on two ends.
