The church of Corinth faced a tension between its members with such dynamic. The Apostle Paul called the members of the church of Corinth to align their minds with the mind of Christ, who as Paul said, 'though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death — even death on a cross.' The word 'empty' is translated from the Greek word 'Kenosis' which means to 'empty out' or 'set aside'. Jesus emptied out himself or set aside his authority and privilege in order to fulfil his mission in the world and through which, God exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name.

This might be something for each and every one of us here at CLC to consider and ponder about. How can we align our great minds together to be like the mind of Christ in our ministry of Making Christ Known? I know we have very gifted people in our church with myriad of great ideas. WELCA CRAFT FAIR

A Brief History By Bonnie Kroening

The Women of the E LCA (WELCA) Craft Fair was started by Eleanor Dean on the 3rd Saturday in October 1992. Eleanor felt that handcrafted items for Fall, Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas could be sold. Vendors that wish to participate were able to rent booth space for \$20 with a table and 2 chairs. Retired men from the church set up tables on Friday so vendors could set their booth that night or early Saturday morning. In following years, Ed Schuette and men who played basketball on Thursday nights started to help with the set up. Nowadays we ask for help from church members on Thursday night.

The first year of the fair we had craft workshops to make Advent calendars, which sold for \$20 each. Then other years we had different workshops for our crafts including stuffed animals made by the Needleswork group, ornaments, pumpkins, Christmas trees, note cards, tote bags, dishcloths, and scrubbies, just to name a few.

The women of the old Wednesday Circle handled the baked goods table. They baked items and asked for donations of baked treats, which always sold very well. If the baked goods did not sell out on Saturday, the ladies sold the remaining goodies on Sunday morning.

At some point I asked about selling food for breakfast and lunch. Since I had asked the question, I was given the responsibility of creating these offerings. Now we sell a breakfast casserole with muffin, or a donut and coffee; lunch offerings include Mary Glasscock's famous chili, chicken salad made by Danna Hesse and myself, hot dogs, chili dogs, chips and drinks. All items are delicious and a bargain!

In the beginning, the Lutheran Brotherhood gave us matching funds. We had to have members of Lutheran Brotherhood help and track hours worked.

Some changes have been made over the years In 1997 I took over as event coordinator working to obtain vendors, set up ads, organize volunteers, etc. For a few years we had a silent auction where vendors were asked to donate one of their items The fair has happened annually since 1992 with only 2 years we were unable to have it; once in 2018 due to my knee replacement surgery and in 2020 due to Covid 19. Our proceeds thru the years have enabled WELCA buy a refrigerator, freezer, dishes, silverware, cookware, glassware, coffeepots, tables and chairs, a new pulpit, tablecloths, landscaping, gift cards for pastor to give to those in need, disasters. We gave also been able to make donations to Chile, the Racetrack ministry, the Center for Women and Children, JAM, Good Samaritan Rehab Center, purchase supplies for quilts for Lutheran World Relief and so much more.

We want to thank all those individuals who have helped with the craft fair throughout the years! We hope you will continue to help make our fair a success for years to come.




