Advent Greetings to you all,

Believe it or not the Advent season is here! On Sunday November 20 we celebrated the Christ the King Sunday marked as the end of the church's

calendar year. We begin our church new calendar year with Advent. The word 'Advent is translated from the Latin word 'adventus' which means 'coming into'; a four-week period of preparation before Christmas. We understand advent also as a period of waiting or anticipating of something good to happen. During the season of Advent, we focus on waiting and anticipating the coming of Jesus the hope of the world. At the same time to celebrate the Emmanuel, God is with us now and always through his present in bread and wine as we look forward for his second coming in glory.

- The changing of our church's paraments to blue that symbolizes our anticipation and hope for the coming of Jesus, King of kings.
- 4 An Advent wreath with four blue candles that signify four weeks before Christmas. We will light each candle every Sunday leading up to Christmas
- We will gather for midweek services both at noon and evening at 7:00pm, beginning November 30, that will help heighten our awareness and anticipation for the celebration of Jesus, the Word becomes flesh and dwells among us. We chose the theme for our Midweek services this year 'Make Ready for Holy Disruption' as we contemplate upon three topics throughout the three Wednesdays of Advent "Releasing, Receiving and Rejoicing".
- † 12 Symbols of Christmas intergenerational program that will take place on Sunday December 18 in the sanctuary at 9:45 a.m.
- Blue Christmas. We intensify our Christmas preparation this year by having the 'Blue Christmas' the first time in our church on the darkest time of the year, the winter solstice on Wednesday December 21 at 6:00PM as we anticipate the coming of Jesus, the Light of the world where darkness cannot overcome it.
- The joyous Christmas Eve celebrations at 5:00PM and 9:00PM on December 24. Once again, we expect or anticipate more of our children/youth participation in our early service. We will invite again our Japanese Christian church friends to join our worship. And on Christmas day we will have our Christmas tradition of Lessons and Carrols at the 11:00AM.

Finally, Advent is also a time to expect the unexpected or anticipate the unanticipated. Indeed, often times God reveals himself to us in unexpected or unanticipated ways; full of surprises and joys! Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you!

## **GROWING YOUNG WORKSHOP**

It is an undeniable reality that the young people are less interested in the church. It happened before the pandemic and has been made even worse after the pandemic. But a recent study conducted by Fuller Youth Institute that interviewed many young people showed some hope.

They discovered six essential strategies to help young people discover and love their church once again. They have proven those strategies to be working in several churches in the country. This workshop was offered in our I-K synod Professional rostered leaders' conference in October.

Pr. Karleen and I arranged to have this workshop to done here at our church. On Sunday, November 13 our church hosted the **Growing**Young Workshop presented by Pr. Dan Fugate, Assistant to the Bishop of the Indiana Kentucky Synod. Some of our members and members of other churches in our conference and clergies attended the workshop.

Below are the six essential strategies or core commitments for Growing Young church:

- the Unlock Keychain leadership: Instead of centralizing authority, empower others especially young people.
- † Empathizing with today's young people: Instead of judging or criticizing, step into the shoes of this generation.
- † Take Jesus' message seriously: Instead of asserting formulaic gospel claims, welcome young people into a Jesus-centered way of life.
- † Fuel a warm community: Instead of focusing on cool worship or programs, aim for warm peer and intergenerational friendships.
- Prioritize young people (and families) everywhere: Instead of giving lip service to how much young people matter, look for creative ways to tangibly support, resource, and involved them in all aspects of your congregation.
- ⊕ Be the best neighbors: Instead of condemning the world outside your walls, enable young people to neighbor well locally and globally.

We are hoping to incorporate this into our upcoming visioning process. If you have any question please feel free to contact me.
