

PROPERTY COMMITTEE UPDATE

At the property committee meeting in October, we discussed getting back to using the blue vouchers on the wall by the office for property issues that might need some attention. Anyone that sees something that is broken, or light bulbs burned out, or something amiss, please fill out a blue voucher and put it in the property mailbox. If something needs immediate attention, please let the office know immediately, so the proper person(s) can be notified.

Also, the committee approved to have the parking lot resealed as soon as possible by PSI Paving. Cost is \$12,475.

The mailboxes were knocked down one evening, so the church's mailbox was moved closer to the office.

The security fob locks on the exterior office door and on one gym door have been installed. Do not use a door key to enter those two doors, only a fob. Pastor Bimen has an app to let people in remotely using the fob. A key remains workable on the other church doors. Security cameras have also been installed around the exterior of the church building.

A defibrillator has been ordered, according to Pastor Bimen. property committee recommends that it be installed in the hallway by rooms 1 & 2, closer to the Narthex. That way it will be close to the sanctuary and the gym, if it is needed.

Wednesday Friends continue to invite you to join us on Wednesday mornings around 9:30 -11:30 to help clean up the outside property.


