VISIONING MEETNG FOLLOW UP

Once again the main purpose of this visioning process is to revisit and refresh our mission of Making Christ Known and our vision of being connected to God, to One Another and the World; which is in alignment with the synod's transformational ministry initiative called 'E-Connect' by:

- Lining up the congregation's purpose, identity, and mission with God's vision and plan.
- Renewing our congregation by linking the gifts that God has given us with God's vision for the world.
- ✤ Celebrating and using what we have, rather than lamenting about and focusing on what we don't have.
- ✤ Finding energy, purpose and direction through God's work—prayer, conversation, and faith practices.
- ✤ Navigating change calmly, confidently and effectively.

We hope through this visioning process, our congregational members will become energized about the Good News of Jesus Christ and passionate about sharing and living the Gospel; trusting that God has provided everything we need to carry out the ministry God called us.

Last Sunday, February 19, we had our first 'big' meeting with our members to begin our visioning process. Pr. Nany Nyland, the IK-Synod's Director of Evangelical Mission (DEM) came and led the meeting and an exercise to discover our assets that included the people, building, our spiritual gifts and skills. We were pleased to see a great number of individuals in attendance and participating in the meeting. We have folks who compiled and organized the results systematically.

The next steps are:

✤ To interview our community leaders.

Mike Kull, our council member has volunteered to lead this effort. He and his team will contact our community leaders in the next few weeks; our mayor, police department, fire department, schools, business leaders, organizations' leaders and etc., to learn more about our community, their needs and the gaps where we can be partnering with them with the gifts or assets that we already have. ✤ History Exercise

The purpose of this exercise is to learn our history and DNA by reflecting our past and present with all the ups and downs as we move forward to the future. You can expect to have another big meeting again for this exercise. Dale Breitenstein will lead this effort.

After all these steps, Pr. Nancy will lead a workshop of how to process all the data and information that we have as we develop our new mission strategies.

Hopefully the council will be able to give us a time line for this process soon. We will keep our congregation updated on the process moving forward.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS

The Christian Education committee was honored to host retired Air Force First Sargent Don Barbiea, co-founder of the Roll Call Foundation the last Sunday in February. Don shared with our group his personal experiences during his 7 tours of duty in Iraq and Afghanistan. As you can imagine he now suffers from PTSD, depression, and anxiety. To help cope he co-founded the Roll Call Foundation with other retired veterans. He explained that one of his responsibilities while in the military was to take Roll Call every morning to make sure all were present and accounted for.



The Roll Call Foundation is carrying out that mission still, whether it is taking phone calls from suffering active or retired military members, visiting senior veterans and widows of veterans at Morning Point, or planning events to help fundraise for children with special needs. What makes this organization different from other veteran groups and resources? None of the members or volunteers are employees or have salaries. One hundred percent of funds raised go to

the foundation to help with various projects including helping to build a handicap accessible playground, 5K runs/walks, equine therapy with retired military horses, or taking meals to our first responders and healthcare workers, just to name a few. The main goal is to help one person every day, a promise made to Jesse (one of the many youths Don has helped) who died of brain cancer at 17 years old.


