Later, these forty days were associated with Jesus' forty days in the desert prior to his temptation (Matthew 4:1-11) and with the forty years the Israelites spent in the wilderness (Number 14:3). Sometimes forty refers to the forty days of rains that flooded the earth during the time of Noah (Genesis 7:17).

Some people during Lent refrain from eating certain foods or from drinking certain drinks as part of their spiritual disciplines. All is right and proper. But if we refrain from eating or drinking, let us be mindful of those who are hungry in our community and share our bounty. May we also refrain from doing things that harm others and God's creations. But most of all, I would like to invite you to join with me during the forty days of Lent to fast and spend more time in prayers, reading the Scriptures and serve others that God may renew our hearts and minds.

As I think of the true fasting, I think of what Pope Francis' words of what he defines as the best fasting for us to contemplate:

- Fast on offensive words and transmit only sweet and tender words.
- Fast on dissatisfaction and fill yourself with gratitude.
- Fast on anger and fill yourself with meekness and patience.
- Fast on pessimism and be filled with optimism.
- Fast on worries and be filled with confidence in God.
- Fast on laments and take pleasure in the simple things of life.
- Fast on stress and fill yourself with prayer.
- Fast on sadness and bitterness, and fill your heart with joy.
- Fast on selfishness, and be filled with compassion for others.
- Fast on unforgiveness and vendetta, and be filled with acts of reconciliation and forgiveness.
- Fast on words and fill yourself with silence and readiness to listen to others

Have blessed journey of Lent.

MUSIC NOTES

A couple of bravos are in order. The first is to the hearty choir members who braved the icy and cold conditions to sing on Christmas Eve – I'm sure everyone who was there in person and on-line appreciated (as I did) their talent and efforts! The second is to whoever cleaned the balcony on the property work day right after Christmas – it was in dire need and I, for one, am grateful to the person or persons who spiffed it up!

It is about time to take a closer look at a hymn/tune again. I have chosen the tune *Beach Spring* for this month. It appears in ELW with three different texts: *Wash, O God, Our Sons and Daughters* (#445) which we sang on Jan. 8 on Baptism of Our Lord Sunday; *Lord, Whose Love in Humble Service* (#712) which we frequently sing during Lent; and *Come to Me, All Pilgrims Thirsty* (777).

Beach Spring is attributed to a self-taught singing school teacher from South Carolina, Benjamin Franklin White (1800-18790), who with Elisha King published *The Sacred Harp* in 1844. *The Sacred Harp* and *The Southern Harmony* were collections of southern white spirituals which were written in four-shape (or shape note) notation. Probably the best-known shape-note tune is *New Britain/Amazing Grace*. This tradition was used in Appalachia and the rural South and made it easy for those with little or no music-reading ability to read music. The shapes were round/oval, diamond, triangle and square and each note shape represented the pitches fa, sol, la and mi. The music was sung without instrumental accompaniment, and people would sometimes gather for a day or weekend of shape-note singing. One of the largest and best-known of these festivals is still held in Benton, Kentucky on the fourth Sunday in May and is called the Big Singing.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS

On a snowy January Sunday morning we enjoyed listening to and learning from Ron McKulick with WaterStep. Finally, the question has been answered, what do our shoe donations have to do with clean water? The shoes collected are sold to an exporter and the funds received help bring water to those in need. The exporter sells the shoes to local vendors in developing countries (some of which WaterStep does water purification projects in). This business model helps to provide funds for WaterStep, the exporter and those small business owners in developing countries, benefiting their economy.

One hundred pounds of shoes helps three people. To date here at Christ Lutheran we have collected 17 bins of shoes. Ron told us that each bin is about 50 lbs. Therefore, we have helped bring clean water to 283 people around the world. We have made an impact, a ripple effect!!! But there is still a long way to go. Overall, WaterStep has helped bring clean water to 8 million people in several different countries. They have also been involved in disaster relief here in the U.S. if called upon. After watching some videos and seeing the equipment used, we learned that all it takes is salt, a car battery, and solar power to turn contaminated water into clean water, a necessity, and bountiful blessing.

If you would like to help further than doating your gently used shoes, they are always looking for volunteers to help sort shoes, give presentations or you can call them and ask, "how can I help?"


