Grace and peace to you my sisters and brothers in Christ,

It is graduation season! One of my favorite things to do when I am at home is to sit outside in our back

yard. I enjoy sitting on the swing or hammock enjoying our gardens and watching the fish in our pond. But lately I am particularly mesmerized by the birds. We have birds' nests all over our place; in our gazebos, garden trellises or shrubs. I have been watching momma birds brooding their eggs or the baby birds that have been hatched are ready to leave their nests. Sometimes the momma birds will help them fly, starting with little hope and before long they go off.

They remind me of this time of year as the time of graduation. Last Sunday we acknowledged and celebrated sixteen graduates this year from elementary school all the way to college. They are like those eggs that were brooded or incubated for the last couple years in their schools

Whether graduating from elementary, middle, high school or college, one thing in common is that they will venture into an unknown future. It is challenging for the graduates and parents. For parents whose kids are graduating from high school might experience the empty nest syndrome.

We thank God for their resilience especially during this challenging time. We also thank parents and their teachers for their support. They are now facing new challenges and uncertainties about their future; what next! In their uncertainty about the future however, may God's words from Jeremiah keep them focused. For indeed the Lord knows the plan He has for them, for their welfare and not for harm, to give them a future and hope.

For Jesus' disciples, Pentecost was like a graduation ceremony. Jesus, their teacher and master, had spent three years with them teaching them many things and showing them how to serve. After Pentecost, their title was changed from 'disciple' or 'student' to 'apostle'; from the one who sits at the feet of the teacher into the one who is sent out into the world to continue the work of the teacher. Likewise with our church, by God's grace, may God graduate us from being members of the church to become Jesus' disciples and even more to become his apostles who are sent into the world to bring good news of the gospel in words and deeds. We trust in God's promise of our welfare and a future with hope. When we wonder what our future will hold, we are rest assured that God is the one who will hold the future. With that I offer this prayer:

"O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen" (ELW, p. 317)

FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

¹⁵ When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." 16 A second time he said to him, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." 17 He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep." -- John 21:15-17

This passage has been playing on repeat in my brain recently. Peter must have felt such shame and disconnection after denving Jesus 3 times, but here Jesus cancels out those denials by giving Peter the opportunity to publicly proclaim love for his Savior 3 times. Then he gives Peter 3 assignments to response, pairing deeds with words. How many times have we denied Him, and He has reached out to us in a desire to reconcile? How are we feeding his lambs, tending his sheep, feeding his sheep? CLC's constitution states our mission (C4.05.01.B12): to "make Christ known, to get connected to God, connected to one another, and connected to the community through Jesus' gracious love" (3 groups and 3 actions in 1). Recent focus in our church has been on setting up the office to best support our Pastor, staff, and congregation (3 more groups in 1), so each can be successful in their roles for fulfilling that mission. At the same time, we're working through a visioning process with 3 homework steps—congregational assets, history timeline, and community interviews (3 more actions in 1)—again to look for ways CLC can further its mission. I pray we all look for ways to say "Yes!" and serve when He calls.

Here are some updates since last month:

Staffing: We're grateful to have Heather Harding from Kelly Services now supporting our congregation in the church office, on a temporary (potentially permanent) basis. Please be sure to introduce yourself, welcome, and support her! Council member Alex Casey is now leading efforts to refine the job description and setting up structured processes for training and support. I can already see Alex's leadership, education, and professional experience in HR, setting us on a sure path forward. Many, many thanks to Alex, Heather, Becky Miller, Nancy Walsh, Liz Walker, Karen Koch, Odette Salman, and Kathleen Breitenstein—all have spent a lot of time and effort to support our congregation in the set up and administration of church life at CLC. Their behind-the-scenes work has huge impact.

- † Visioning Community Leader Interviews & History Project: Council's homework is complete! Next council will meet with Pr Nancy Nyland (IN-KY Synod Director for Evangelical Mission) on Sat 6/3 at the Koch residence for an all-day workshop. We'll review the results of our Congregational Asset Conversation, the Community Leader Interviews, and the History Project, in hopes to see where the Spirit may be leading CLC in mission next.
- In April-May, IN-KY Synod held a 3-part webinar on **Expanding Your Mission Center: Choosing Digital Ministry**, attended by several CLC members. My takeaway was that there are a few congregations who are doing a better job—and many others that we are ahead of—when it comes to managing a digital presence. Given the changing nature of technology, it's an area that will never have a "once and done" setup. To be effective in our mission, we'll need to review, tweak, and improve continuously to fit our congregation's specific needs. There are lot of exciting possibilities for growing an online mission field, and as with everything else, will just require some time and talent to make it happen!
- The IN-KY Synod Assembly will be held virtually on 6/10/23. Pastor Bimen will be attending with lay members Joyce Anderson and David Bremner. Many thanks to Joyce and David for your interest in participating. I look forward to hearing about your experience at the assembly!

As always, I and my fellow council members ask for your feedback, suggestions, support, and most of all prayers, that we lead with wisdom and compassion, in all we do for Christ and Christ Lutheran Church.
