The visioning process to me is like a process of giving birth starting from conception, gestation and all the way to birth that will take about nine months. During the nine months of pregnancy is filled with active waiting and anticipating by preparing everything needed for the birth of a new baby. As we all may know, when the baby is born, life will never be the same again. It seems that we are in the last trimester of our visioning gestation.

In our last council visioning workshop with Pr. Nany Nyland, we discussed all the findings we collected from our congregational asset mapping exercises, our church history and interviews with our local leaders. From those discussions, we were able to identify our assets and values. Then we were able to define our guiding Principles and mission statement.

These are our guiding principles:

- ⊕ Listen and lead with purpose following God's will
- ⊕ Grow and deepen faith in God
- ⊕ Live generously using God's gifts
- Love and serve one another
- → Maintain intentional communication.

From these, we defined our new Mission Statement or the Statement of Purpose: "Walking with Christ, we love and serve our church and neighbors." We will start incorporating this statement as we dismiss people at the end of our service. We will continue to keep you updated what our next steps will be. Thank you for your patience in our journey together as we walk with Christ, let's love and serve our church and neighbors.

FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

We're nearing the finish line on several ongoing projects! Here's this month's updates:

- † Staffing: Heather continues to be a blessing in the office, we are thankful for her support! The job description and SOP document for the office position is in its final stages of revision as we apply feedback from members who've recently served in this capacity. We expect this to be distributed for council approval within the next week or two so we can move on to securing a permanent hire. Thank you for your patience as we strive to create realistic, sustainable processes and support for all.
- **Endowment Committee opening filled:** Council approved the nomination of Joyce Anderson to fill the open seat on the Endowment Committee.
- * Kitchen Update: Electrical updates should be done within two weeks, then equipment will be ordered. (2) 36" electric ranges should arrive within a week, while the warmer unit may take a few weeks to arrive.
- † IN-KY Synod Assembly, Sat 6/10 virtual session: Unfortunately, technical issues and family emergency kept Joyce Anderson and David Bremner from attending. Pastor Bimen was able to attend however, reporting to council that the assemble was fairly uneventful, with the votes primarily related to updating the paternity leave policy and committee assignments.
- the Breach, Thurs 6/15 webinar: Pr. Bimen, Karen Koch, Mike Kull, and I attended this day-long webinar. It was an interesting, though high-level, presentation which outlined how although the Covid-19 pandemic certainly exacerbated things, a decline in social and civic engagement (especially in-person social interactions) actually began decades ago in our society, with the increase of dual career households, suburbanization and commuting, electronic entertainment, and generational changes in family dynamics. This in turn has led to growing estrangements, isolation, anxiety, depression, and deaths of despair (suicide, overdose, addictions). A rise in membership in non-face-to-face organizations (groups like AARP, Sierra Club, or other activist groups), hasn't provided the sense of meaning, belonging, and purpose that people yearn for.

What has been observed is people who participate in church life do experience a sense of connection and hope that nonreligious organizations, or even private prayer, fail to duplicate. While we hoped to hear more practical, specific methods for healing relationships, the takeaway did confirm that CLC is on the right track in our efforts in self-examination, inviting participation, and focusing on creating opportunities to deepen our relationships with God and one another. Leading us to...

Visioning: On Sat 6/3, council met for a day-long workshop facilitated by Pr Nancy Nyland (IN-KY Synod Director for Evangelical Mission). You may have noticed our conversation notes posted in the Narthex. Reviewing our congregational assets, community interviews, and CLC history, we noticed the need to connect with love and meaningful service was a recurring theme within and outside of our church walls. To renew our focus to these needs, council approved to adopt a new mission statement, "Walking with Christ, we love and serve our church and neighbors." So now what? We want to hear your thoughts on how we put this vision into action and will be setting up multiple venues to collect ideas. Be on the lookout for more on that soon. Please prayerfully consider, what do you want to see our congregation doing? Then speak up and volunteer—let's look for ways to do God's work with our hands, together!
