## COUNCIL UPDATE

Because Pastor Bimen was at the ELCA Rostered Ministers gathering in Phoenix, AZ, no major actions were taken this month at our regular council meeting. However, here are a few updates on continuing progress and committee projects:
$\ddagger$ Staffing - We are nearing the finish line for filling the office administrator position and will be turning our attention next to finding a Director of Youth and Children Ministry!
§Property - We are waiting for the electricians to fit our small kitchen upgrade on their calendar. Once scheduled, appliances for the kitchen will be ordered. We've also finalized a bid for our parking lot to be repaired, resealed, and restriped.
§Communications - Communication Committee has several projects underway, including working on restarting the announcement slideshow in the solarium and assisting council with communicating next steps with the congregation on our visioning process.
§Council Contact Sheet - If you're not sure who to ask about a specific activity or ministry, a contact sheet of all council members has been posted on the bulletin board outside of Rooms $1 / 2$. We'll be adding committee and other contact details there soon!
$\ddagger$ Building Usage Policies - Worship Committee updated our wedding and funeral policies and guidelines. Next month, council will review general building usage policies (for meeting spaces, kitchen, and gym). While there are no major changes in policy, as events in our building are gradually increasing post-pandemic, it's good to provide clear guidelines for our office and Pastor to share, so our church may serve as better hosts, and our members and community groups have clear expectations when holding activities in our building.
§ Volunteers - We have a lot of opportunities for getting involved and living out our mission of walking with Christ, we love and serve our church and neighbors. Please prayerfully consider where you can put your spiritual gifts into action! Our upcoming involvement at the Gaslight Festival requires some friendly faces to represent CLC. Our community picnic in September will require a wide range of talents-if you're interested in supporting this event, we'll find a spot for you! We're also looking to re-activate and/or re-imagine our Befrienders group, training members to serve Communion and minister to the homebound, infirm, or anyone in need of loving support. We continue to look for those willing to help with our online streaming - on the job training is provided! If you enjoy weddings, we're hoping to establish paid volunteer(s) to serve as a wedding host, guiding and supporting those choosing CLC for their marriage worship service. Be on the lookout for more information on all of these programs, and feel free to contact a council member or committee head if you'd like to get connected!
