"Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us? (Luke 24:32)

Grace and peace to you my brothers and sisters in Christ,

I want you all to become more familiar with our church's new mission statement or the statement of purpose, "Walking with

Christ, We love and Serve our church and neighbors". This statement came to birth as the result of our visioning process after we did our church's assets mapping exercise, reexamined our history and conducted interviews with leaders in our community. From now on, everything that we do should reflect that statement.

As I have been thinking about the first half of our mission statement, 'Walking With Christ' the image from the Scriptures that keep popping up in my mind is 'the walk to Emmaus'; two of Jesus' disciples, Cleopas and his companion walked to Emmaus on the evening of his resurrection day. The walk to Emmaus seems to me an appropriate image or story for us to consider and reflect as we implement our mission statement.

Before we love and serve our church and neighbors, first and foremost is that we need to walk with Christ. We need to center our life and our life together in Christ and the Scriptures otherwise we have nothing else to share. Our church is more than a social entity; our church is the body of Christ and the community of faith that is grounded in Christ and his words.

When we walk together, we are in an accompaniment with each other. In walking together we are equal; no one is higher than the other nor one is more important that the other. Like the disciples, as we walk together and talk about Jesus and his word, we soon discover that Jesus joins us in the journey and takes the center stage. By grounding ourselves in the Scriptures and prayers in our walking together will keep our hearts burning within ourselves. It will also nourish and empower us to do the second part of our mission statement; 'to love and serve our church and our neighbors'.

At the end of the walk to Emmaus story, the disciples invited Jesus to stay for the night. Likewise, even though we know Jesus is always with us, but it is always good to intentionally invite him into our lives, homes, our church and fellowship. Furthermore, we invite people to Jesus.

When the disciples invited Jesus to their home, they invited Jesus to their table too. When they shared the bread together, their eyes were opened and recognized Jesus. Likewise, when we share our table with others and break bread together with the hungry and the poor, we will discover that Christ is among us. God's revelation that night inspired the disciples to tell the good news of Jesus. The very same hours, they went back to Jerusalem to tell the good news to the rest of the disciples. Our encounter with Jesus through his Word and sacraments, inspire and empower us to do his works.

The moral story of the Walk to Emmaus aligns not just for our mission statement but also with our guiding principles to which we reflect our ministry:

- \*Listen and lead with purpose, following God's will
- \*Grow and deepen faith in God
- \*Live generously using God's gifts
- \*Love and serve and one another
- \*Invite and welcome neighbors
- \*Maintain intentional communication

### **PROPERTY UPDATES**



## Mark your calendars! Christ Lutheran Church is hosting District 11's FREE paper document shredding event!

### Saturday, September 30<sup>th</sup>, 9am – Noon

As part of our visioning process, council members interviewed many local community leaders to explore ways that CLC could become a more visible presence and servant to our community. Among those leaders was our District 11 Councilman Kevin Kramer. During the interview, we learned Councilman Kramer hosted a free shredding event last year that was very popular in our community, and he's since received numerous requests to host another one. Together, we agreed Christ Lutheran Church had a great location for hosting his next shredding event! We're very excited to serve both our J-town community and our congregation, providing everyone with a way to clean house and securely dispose of unneeded documents.

This will be a no contact, drive-through event so residents can remain in their vehicle while volunteers remove documents needing shredding from your trunk or rear seat. Your confidential documents will be shredded onsite and then taken to a recycling facility by their contract company, Shred-It. There's no limit to the number of personal documents that you may bring; however, no businesses are allowed.

#### What cannot be shredded?

- anything containing metal like 3-ring clip binders (staples can be shredded)
- electronic items
- anything plastic like grocery plastic shopping bags excluding credit cards (credit cards can be shredded)
- extremely hard plastic items
- anything possibly containing magnets
- matches, lighters or anything flammable including batteries
- fabric materials like shirts and hats
- boxes will be returned
