### **COUNCIL UPDATE**

- ♣ Staffing We've been checking into resources for sharing out the Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry job opening and will be posting it in various spots this coming month. I reached out to Pr. Boehm for his insight, as Ascension hired their youth director just a few years ago. He gave us some suggestions but shared that it took them well over a year to fill their position, which was very comparable to the hours and pay rate we have in mind. So, patience, prayers, and publicity may be the keys to finding the right candidate for us.
- \* Kitchen Update We can officially call our kitchen update completed! Our two new ranges and the warming unit have been installed, and even given the thumbs up recently from a caterer using our kitchen. The warmer was already put to use during our picnic.
- \$\Psi\$ Synod Updates Pr Nancy Nyland attended our Sept council meeting via Zoom to check on our visioning process and share updates from the Synod office. As previously announced, Bishop Gafkjen will be retiring in Sept 2024, and Pr Dan Fugate has accepted a call as the Pastor of a congregation in Indiana. A new bishop will be elected at next year's annual Synod meeting. CLC was set to host one of this Fall's regional Synod in-person gatherings, but they have been cancelled due to all the staffing transitions.
- Visioning Updates Pr Nyland has been guiding council throughout our visioning process. With her help, we developed our new mission statement, "Walking with Christ, we love and serve our church and our neighbors." We've already gotten busy living out that mission—landscaping at Tully Elementary, hosting a booth at the Gaslight Festival, throwing a community picnic, hosting a Shredding event, and more. Each of those initiatives simply started with identifying a need, identifying solutions, and some folks with willing hearts raising their hands to help. As we enter our annual Stewardship drive, I hope you'll put some creative thought into other ways CLC can live out our mission, and how you can get involved by sharing your time, talent, and treasures. To that end, we'll be celebrating Consecration Sunday on November 19<sup>th</sup> with a potluck lunch, coupled with some congregational brainstorming—what do you want to see CLC start doing, stop doing, or continue doing? How can you employ your spiritual gifts to make things happen?

#### **TOUCHING OUR NEIGHBOR**

The Gospels tell about times when Jesus touched people and often healed them this way. Does this mean we should go around physically laying our hands on people who seem to have problems? Thinking about these Gospel stories can leave us with several questions. What is touching - is it real contact or is it symbolic? Who is our neighbor - someone who lives next to the church or to our home? Could it be one our fellow church members? When do we need to touch someone - during a time of crisis or sorrow?

Let's take a look at CLC. The Social Ministry Committee of Christ Lutheran plans opportunities to help us reach out and touch someone usually, but not always, within our community. Historically, we have reached out to college students, people who need assistance through JAM, people needing visits either at home or in a center, people needing help with fall clean-up or housing needs, and people who need emotional help by sending cards and making visits. We are continually reminded of people needing prayers while experiencing a difficult time in their lives.

One of our repeated avenues of helping neighbors is through JAM, the Jeffersontown Area Ministries. We continually supply food, we have held toilet tissue drives and we provide Christmas gift cards to families. Another on-going ministry of support is through WaterStep which collects gently used shoes to be sent to areas of need throughout the world. During the past few months we shipped 17 bins of shoes. Our youth participate by packing snacks to be given to the homeless in our community through "Street Reach." Other activities have included providing meals for the Ronald McDonald House, providing the foster care agency needed items and sharing presents to residents of the Gaslight Court Apartments.

Are you interested in participating in any of these activities with our congregation? If so, Roger Miller, who chairs the Social Ministry Committee, or Pastor Limbong will be happy to talk with you. It's good to touch someone in need.

### **MUSIC NOTES**

For many of the local folks, October means it is time for the St. James Art Festival. For many Lutherans, October means celebrating the festival of Reformation which we do on the last Sunday in October although the actual date is October 31. This month we'll take a look at one of the three hymns probably most associated with that day.

Built on a Rock (ELW 652) - the other two being A Mighty Fortress Is Our God and Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word - is by the Dane Nikolai F.S. Grundtvig and first appeared with 9 verses in 1837. He later cut the hymn to seven revised stanzas. In 1809 it was translated into English by Carl Doving and later revised by Fred C.M. Hansen for our Service Book and Hymnal (1958) with five stanzas. The church bells in stanzas 1 and 5 provide the frame and point to the center. The falling steeples likely refers to the Carillon in the Church of Our Lady in Copenhagen with was bombed and destroyed by the English army in 1807. (On a personal note it makes me think of the heartbreaking fire that destroyed so much of the Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris a few years ago!) Grundtvig is the author of six other hymns in ELW, the great majority of which are familiar to our congregation.

The tune *Kirken den er et gammelt hus* was written by Ludvig M. Lindeman in 1840 for this hymn and is described by the *Hymnal Companion* as a "compelling and sturdy tune."

Our choir is planning to sing an anthem version of *Built on a Rock* by Mueller on October 29.

At our annual Youth Ministry Planning meeting last month, our youth expressed an interest in doing some hands-on good out in the community. Knowing what a great experience the Nicaragua and Belize trips were, we're considering partnering up with Hand in Hand Ministries again (potentially in April 2024) for one of their local immersion trips.

Louisville projects generally focus on making homes safe and accessible—building wheelchair ramps, installing safety bars in bathrooms, repairing steps, installing handrails, building fences, etc - and the experience can be scheduled as a one day event, or a multi-day immersion experience, for high school youth to adult.

This would not be a commitment at this point, but will help us gauge interest levels and decide where and how the Spirit may lead us to venture back out into the mission field again.
