COUNCIL UPDATE

from Council President, Sarah Pryor

For the last year, Council has been working on a 3-step visioning project with the guidance of Pastor Nancy Nyland from the IN-KY Synod. Once completed, we gathered for a retreat to review the results of all 3 projects and discern what they told us about the past, present, and future of Christ Lutheran Church. The notes made during this retreat have been displayed in the Narthex for several months, inspiring the creation of our new mission statement—*Walking with Christ, we love and serve our church and our neighbors*—as well as the guiding principles to follow as we live out that mission. To further explain the what-why-how behind each step, a series of short videos were recently created. We posted them on our CLC Facebook group, shared them during our Consecration Sunday celebration, and will soon be emailed too. I invite you to check them out. Now that council has completed our visioning homework, we want to hear from *you*. What is *your* vision for CLC?

Whatever your answer, it will require the time, talent, and treasure of all our members. Consecration Sunday on Nov. 19th was a busy day of celebration, turning in our intent of giving cards and Time and Talent sheets, and dedicating our new piano and completed capital campaign projects: the streaming equipment, security system, and kitchen stoves and warmer. We enjoyed a fantastic potluck lunch (our plates runneth over!) and Kathleen Breitenstein led us in a visioning brainstorm activity. Many, many thanks to Kathleen for leading the visioning activity, to Heather Harding for assisting, to Fellowship for hosting lunch, and to everyone who participated. I thank God for blessing Christ Lutheran so richly!

Did you miss Consecration Sunday? We still want to hear from you! If you haven't already, please still turn in an intent card to help us budget, fill out a Time and Talent sheet (this is just an indication of interest—you aren't committing to every box you check!), and provide your visioning input on what we should start/keep/stop doing at CLC. Place these in the church office mailbox, the offering plate, or in the box located in the Narthex. We'll also have an electronic form for visioning ideas. We'll compile the information between now and the end of December, then use them to set some goals for the next year. con't on page 4


OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD
