"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good" (1 Corinthians 12:4-7)

I was struck by an article written by Julian DeShazier, the senior minister of University Church in Chicago who describes how the 80/20 rule is a problem for churches. You may wonder what is the 80/20 rule he is talking about? The 80/20 rule or sometimes it is called 'Pareto principle' originated from an Italian economist named Vilfredo Pareto in 1895. He discovered that 80 percent of the land was owned by 20 percent of the people. This led other social scientists to notice similar patterns across society: the 'vital few' and 'trivial many'. This theory suggests that in any group few (20%) are 'vital' and many (80%) are 'trivial'. For example, in the business world 80 percent of the results come from 20 percent of activity or 20 percent of products generates 80 percent of revenue. Therefore we just need to take care of the vital few to get the most results.

The trend is that there is only about 20 percent of church members doing very much of everything for the church while the 80 percent often times become onlookers who just come to worship and go on with their lives *(or sometimes criticizing the work of the 20 percent.)* As a result, often times the 20 percent will eventually get burned out and quit for carrying the weight of the work alone.

The rule might work in the business world but it is not so with the church. The pastor or the church leaders sometimes tempt to focus on identifying and empowering the 20 percent to get things done. But that is not what the church is all about. For that reason, Julian DeShazier thinks that 80/20 is a problematic in the church. He said it is not biblical and that is not the way the church functions according to Acts chapter 2. The early church emphasized more communal functioning, instead of individuals only, where everyone is expected to pitch in as they could. Everybody brings something to the table.

In our church, feeding the homeless for instance, is not just the work of our social ministry or evangelism committees; it is the work of the church. Welcoming visitors or strangers is not the work of the fellowship or hospitality committees, but it is the work of the church and so forth. God's loving work is not supposed to belong to a committee or individuals, but it belongs to all of us. We all are the church together.

By no means do we say that we don't need committees, but we go beyond them. Recently we have gone beyond the 80/20 rule and surpassed our church committees by working together to a common purpose such as: Gaslight Festival, Community Picnic, Care Packaging, Caring Ministry and Dream Team just to name a few. People who were involved in those events found meaning and purpose and were excited to do it again. So it is not enough to rely on 80/20 but a 100 percent rule, where everybody participates in God's works. So sisters and brothers, I invite you all to walk with Christ to love our church and neighbors generously with the variety of gifts that we already have.

Driving to Our Future!!



In the Fall, we met as a congregation and started the process of asking what we would like to start doing, what we wanted to keep doing and what we thought we should stop doing. Responses have been gathered and some themes are starting to emerge.

Start (green) Fellowship, Worship, Membership and Community received the most responses. As a congregation, we want to be more present and active in our local community. We also want to grow in our faith and worship practices, grow stronger as a faith community and repurpose our facility to accommodate these changes.

Keep (yellow) responses were highest for Fellowship, Worship, Community and Christian Education. Though three of these four areas are the same in Start/Keep, the focus is different which opens the door to many growth opportunities.

Stop(**red**) responses focused a lot on the environment and being good stewards of the earth by increasing recycling efforts and using less plastic. Also mentioned was the need to stop finding faults without also working to find solutions.

These comments and data are now in the hands of our Council members for next steps to be determined. Be watching for more information on these next steps and how you, yes, you, can be part of moving our church forward toward our future!

A CARING MINISTRY

A Caring Ministry? What are we talking about? Isn't all our ministry "caring ministry"? ABSOLUTELY! We are all doing that, as we do things for each other and to help each other.

Can we do more? Are we missing people? FOR SURE!

Think about all the social ministry projects: quilts and baby blankets, CREW visits, Forest Hills Commons (church services & special occasions acknowledgments like Valentine's Day, Easter & Christmas), weekly prayer meeting, care packages for college students and homebound members, and many other things I am sure I have forgotten about. These are all caring ministries.

We started out a number of years ago with BeFrienders - a structured program that requires training and a significant time committent. It is not for everyone. It is focused on short term crisis intervention. This program made us aware of the need for other approaches to a caring ministry. We wanted to help others become involved and that's how the card ministry developed. It now has a thriving life of its own. We hear comments weekly of how much this mean to the recipients.

Other areas where people can be involved include visits, calls, texts, meals, taking communion to shut ins, childcare, transportation, etc. WE do many of these things because that is **who we are and what we do.** We do not want to take the place of staying in touch with friends and helping where you can, but we want to fill in where someone might be overlooked.

We are starting with three teams to help do this. **Visitation and Communication** will make visits to members who are homebound or in assisted living / nursing homes & hospitals, as well as calling and texting these individuals. Pam Ballinger is the team leader for this group. Her phone number is 502-321-3540.

Sherry Davis will serve as the team leader for our **Hospitality team**. This team will focus on meals and cards. Her phone number is 502-266-7943. We invite you to work on any or as many of these teams as you want. **Everyone can be a part of this!!**

We want to provide Pastor Bimen with a pool of people who are willing to makes phone calls, visit, provide communion, etc. Remember, we all need to help keep him informed. When you become aware of someone who needs a call or visit, make sure you let him know. We want our church family to know that when they can't get to church, they are not forgotten.




ASH WEDNESDAY 2024
