# JULY FAITHFUL SERVANT Sherry Davis



There's a simple reason Sherry Davis stays active at Christ Lutheran. "I want to see our church grow," she explains.

As a member of CLC for 29 years, Sherry has been a big part of our ongoing growth. She's taught Sunday School and confirmation, participated in many small groups including WELCA, and volunteered in the church office. For 25 years, she has fueled her spiritual growth and others' through monthly group Bible study, and she also joins the Monday

Prayer Meeting to pray for shut-ins and others in need.

Currently, Sherry is on the Fellowship Committee, which provides meals for people in our congregation. Through the Caring Ministry, she and the team send cards to members in special need of encouragement or support. The ministry has just started bringing meals to members who are coping with difficult life challenges.

Sherry also serves on a team that's vital to our church's health, even if it isn't as visible as some of our other committees. The Mutual Ministry team provides a safe space for Pastor Bimen to talk about any concerns or hurdles he might be facing, allowing him to stay focused on the spiritual needs of the congregation and community.

Sherry and husband Mark have recently joined the CLC Dream Team, a group of volunteers who meet to hash out new ideas for growing the church. With no plans to slow down, she has this advice for anyone who wants to grow socially or spiritually:

"Get involved! You don't have to commit to something big. Try a Thirsty Thursday or paint a walking stick. There's something for everyone at Christ Lutheran!"

#### JULY FAITHFUL SERVANT Luke Dawson

Luke Dawson isn't shy about how he feels.

"I'm a big Christian," he exclaims proudly. "It's like the song — 'I don't want to be a casual Christian.' I want to worship God every day and follow Him."

Luke finds lots of ways to do that at Christ Lutheran. This 10-year-old Faithful Servant likes to learn new things and "tries to always pay



attention" when he participates in the Children's Sermon, Sunday School, and LIFT family classes. He also helps acolyte and put away cups after Communion.

But being a big Christian is about more than learning and helping. For Luke, it's also about fun and fellowship. Favorite events include Trunk or Treat and Vacation Bible School, and you can often find him rallying on the pickleball courts with Samuel and Petra Limbong.

Luke encourages other children (of all ages) to get active at CLC and has this practical advice: "Come up and try it! If you like it, that's okay. If you don't, that's okay too."

Over the summer, Luke has also been taking golf lessons as he gets ready to start 5<sup>th</sup> grade at Farmer Elementary. He knows sometimes it's hard to try something new, which is why Christ Lutheran is the perfect place to learn and grow.

"If you're nervous, remember, no one will bully you or say mean things. The only thing people will do is give you a warm welcome."

#### ST. THOMAS MASS

The St. Thomas Mass was held June 30<sup>th</sup>. This Mass is one way we offer an alternative worship experience in addition to our traditional and praise worship services. It offers an opportunity for interaction between the pastor and worshippers. The service is more inclusive and at the same time meditative as we move to various stations. The stations included anointing, receiving Holy Communion, submitting prayer requests, a display of shells illustrating that through Baptism God loves us all, a chance to paint rocks to give away at the Gaslight Festival, the chance to write our obstacles/sins and to nail the papers to a cross which were burned prior to the paraments. On display were the paraments to be retired, decommissioned and burned. Thanks to all who helped plan, set up and put away the items needed to make this Mass meaningful.

After the worship service, worshippers were invited to the patio area behind the brick house to participate in the retirement and decommissioning of a set of old, unused paraments. This process ends the review of old paraments that are no longer usable to adorn the chancel area of the sanctuary. The proper way to 'dispose' of paraments is to burn them and not put them in the dumpster since they were once commissioned and blessed to be a part of our worship services. Thank you to Steven Sarson for providing his fire pit and to all who participated.

The lunch following was well attended. Everyone enjoyed time together sharing a meal and conversation. Thanks to Bonnie and the fellowship team for heading up the lunch. Thanks be to God

Overall, 100% opinion was it was a great experience!






