


Movie night was a spooky success! Thanks to all who attended, the

FAITHFUL SERVANT Mike Kull



Mike Kull has been coming to Christ Lutheran Church since 1959. In that time, he's seen a lot of change — and tallied a few spreadsheets. As Chair of CLC's Finance Committee, Mike leads a group of seven to monitor the church's financial transactions, prepare the annual budget, and report to the Council, of which Mike is also a current member.

Mike organizes our team of offering counters, coordinating as many as 25 individuals over the course of the year. "It's an uncomplicated way to serve," Mike says. "It doesn't take long, but it's so important. And something we have to do each week." (In other words, if you're interested in serving this way, talk to Mike!)

Every week, Mike also helps lead the Sunday School class in Room 1. "There's no teacher for the class, really. We all just try to lead one another."

If you notice a theme among Mike's activities, it might be leadership — perhaps a natural fit given his management background. But he's very quick to emphasize it takes many people to keep CLC running smoothly and fiscally responsibly, including Treasurer Tony White, Financial Secretary Karen Schuette, John Schmitt, the Council, and even — or especially — the Congregation.

But what is also clearly a natural fit is his role as a Faithful Servant. "Being active and serving the church," Mike explains simply, "is just the way my parents brought me up."

From serving on the Stewardship Committee to taking Pastor Bimen to the airport, Nancy Walsh has done a little bit of everything.

Formerly a member from 1973-1998, she rejoined CLC in 2014 and has been going strong ever since. A short list of Nancy's activities includes teaching and working in the kitchen for VBS; serving on the Christian

Education Committee; volunteering in the Church office; participating in WELCA Bible study, Sunday School, and Monday prayer group; sending "Get Well" cards and taking communion to homebound congregants; and visiting senior citizens at Forrest Hills every second Sunday of the month. And she always tries to bring something to potlucks or bake treats for special events!

A retired math teacher, Nancy taught for 29 years at Jeffersontown High School and even had our own Beth Armstrong as a student! Today, she still works with the Alumni Association. With an upcoming trip to Barcelona, Nancy isn't planning to slow down anytime soon.

"I guess I like to stay busy," Nancy explains, putting it mildly.

"One of the things I like best is how cordial our congregation is," Nancy says. "Everyone always has a smile, even if we don't know your name."
