kids were younger, we used to go to apple picking and pumpkin patches like Huber. We enjoyed the wagon ride that would take us to the apple orchids to pick our own apples or to the pumpkin patches to pick our pumpkin ready for Halloween. I miss that moment. We enjoyed the harvest even though we were not involved in the process of planting and taking care of them.

Surrounded by farming community, Jesus used an agrarian analogy to explain the urgency of taking actions prayer in response to the great needs of the people. For those of you who are familiar with the farming, you will know that is crucial for the farmers, especially when it comes to harvest time. It cannot be delayed. So, Jesus said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Now is the harvest time. Jesus also said in the other gospel "I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest". (John 4:35). Like in ancient time, people of our time too are in great needs; many people are harassed and helpless like sheep without shepherd. There is an overwhelming wholistic need in the world that we live in physically, mentally and especially spiritually.



Have you ever taken a moment to walk around the church grounds? We have the Wednesday Friends to thank for the beautiful greenery that makes CLC a physical beacon of God's love on a busy street corner. This small group of dedicated servants keeps our church looking its best and ready to welcome all who visit

Two stalwart Wednesday Friends are Raymond and Marilyn Peak. Every week you'll find them at the church on Wednesday mornings around 9:30, pulling weeds, pruning bushes, raking leaves — and the list goes on. Rod Hester mows the lawn, while other "Friends" include Pat Friedman, Roger Miller, and Berliana Limbong. If the weather doesn't cooperate, the group moves inside to take care of other DIY projects.

When asked what exactly the Wednesday Friends does, Ray answers simply, "We look for things that are dirty or need fixing, and we clean or fix them." This includes everything from mulching the playground to washing the backboards on the basketball hoops in the gym. "We can always find something," Marilyn says. "It's just like at home."

Home for the Peaks is another five acres of grass that needs cutting and trees that need trimming. Whenever they pass by the church, though, they drive through the parking lot to see what needs their attention. They also help Dale Breitenstein maintain the graveyard on Watterson Trail in downtown J-Town.

But they do a lot more than landscaping! Ray, a retired accountant, is a member of the Finance Committee, while Marilyn, a former math teacher, is on the Memorial and Property Committees. Working with Thrivent, they've secured grants to help offset costs for plants and mulch. At any given time, you'll find them counting the offering or cleaning bugs out of a light fixture or any other myriad of things that just need to get done.


