Advent blessing to you my sisters and brothers in Christ,

As the snow was coming down on us Sunday morning my first thought was the song by Meredith Wilson, "It's Beginning to Look a Lot Like Christmas". We decorated our church with Christmas trees and lights. During our children sermon on Sunday, I showed that my Christmas cactus has started to bloom although Christmas is still almost a month away. Similarly, many stores had decorated with Christmas decorations as early as October. But, as those signs show a great anticipation of the coming of Christmas 'Holy Day' Eve, we are not quite there yet. We need to spend and focus our time on the Advent season.

During our consecration Sunday's luncheon two Sundays ago, I proposed the idea of declaring the year 2025 as the 'Year of Inviting.' We brainstormed ideas and were able to plan a series of events next year, at least one per month, besides our worship services and all the things we are offering already. #### **MUSIC NOTES**

Advent, the beginning of the liturgical year, begins on December 1 this year. The theme of our three mid-week services is the *Magnificat*, the rapturous song Mary sings when she discovers she will bear the Son of God. There are at least five versions in our hymnal.

One is a part of the Evening Prayer service and is found on p. 314 in the front part of ELW; the other four are hymns: 723-Canticle of the Turning, 882-My Soul Does Magnify the Lord, 573-My Soul Now Magnifies the Lord, and 251-My Soul Proclaims Your Greatness.

The preludes for December 4<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> will be based on yet another tune for this text (*Meine seele erhebt den Herren*) and are by Marcel Dupre and J.S. Bach respectively; the postlude for December 18<sup>th</sup> is simply *Magnificat* by the French Classical composer Jean-Francois Dandrieu.

The Choir will again be singing for the Christmas Eve Service at 9pm. The extended prelude, including choir and organ, will begin around 8:45pm.

Wishing you a hope-filled Advent and a very blessed Christmas!



### FAITHFUL SERVANT Karen Schuette



There's volunteering, and there's being volunteered. For Karen Schuette, a combination of both have kept her active in the church for more than 25 years.

She taught Sunday School when her kids were little, and her class included the niece of the church's longtime Financial Secretary, Lois Knapp. When Lois fell ill, she asked Karen to take over the position, and Karen has been doing it ever since.

As Financial Secretary, Karen keeps track of giving and submits a report to Council each month. Karen remembers when she first started, she had to record gifts on carbon paper. Thankfully, things are much easier now with computers, especially because John Schmitt helps out with the data entry.

In addition to the Finance Committee, Karen is also a member of the Worship Committee. She originally volunteered to help set up Communion. It wasn't long before Becky Miller suggested she join the Worship Committee.

Karen recalls a similar situation when she became a Communion Assistant. "I didn't really know what all it entailed, but somebody asked me if I would try it and I thought, 'well, okay."

Volunteering seems to come naturally to Karen. But for her, CLC is much more than a place to worship and serve.

"My husband and I got married here. But even before that, I went to kindergarten here. There's probably a picture of 5-year-old me somewhere in the church. Growing up in the neighborhood right across the street, I would see those funny evergreen trees out front and know I was home."

# FAITHFUL SERVANT Petra Limbong

Petra Limbong draws strength from his faith. "I know whatever is happening or what I'm thinking, I have God to rely on. I've seen God work through me throughout my entire life."

Most of Petra's life has been spent growing up at CLC, which he considers his second family and even his second house. In fact, Petra's so familiar with the building itself, it makes him feel old to remember how it's changed over the years.



Now a senior at Dupont Manual, Petra is expecting to major in business administration with a minor in political science next year. He wants to focus on the people aspect of business, maybe eventually rising to the ranks of CEO. His life in the church has helped him grow his networking skills, not only within our own congregation but throughout the ELCA.

It's also taught him perseverance. At the Youth Core Leadership Team gathering in Chicago, he tore his ACL — but that hasn't slowed him down. You'll still find him unlocking the doors and turning on the lights at the church, as well as playing pickleball in the gym. At an upcoming Kentucky Youth Assembly, Petra and his team will present a bill about bussing to a group of student delegates from across the state. And he's working on adding organ to his musical repertoire so he can play for the Christmas service

Along the way, Petra has had to make some difficult decisions, like when he had to choose between speaking at the ELCA Youth Gathering or attending the 6-week Governor's Scholars Program at Murray State. That's when Petra turns to his faith.

"I try to see those challenges as opportunities and never take them for granted. It's always important to stay strong in faith."




# Adorn Our Chancel - Order Your Christmas Poinsettias


#### SHREDDING EVENT RECAP

for our District 11 Councilman Kevin Kramer, Legislative Assistant Scott Harrington,






#### THIRSTY THIRD THURSDAYS


