Epiphany greetings to you sisters and brothers in Christ,

It is wonderful to be home indeed, after traveling for 10 days to Asia to attend the Asian Lutheran International Conference (ALIC) in Kota Kinabalu, Malaysia. It was a long trip and filled each day with a busy schedule. Yet it was a wonderful conference. I was able to connect and reconnect with colleague leaders from North America and Asia. It was a wonderful continuing education where you were able to hear keynote presentations from fine theologians and leaders from those continents. I was inspired and humbled to hear their testimonies the way they live out the gospel despite persecution they are facing in their home countries. Their testimonies were not foreign to me, because I myself went through some of the persecution. Yet, they helped and inspired me to stay focused on my call as a Christian and pastor in my ministry context.

Bimen Limbong Director of Music - Ann Colbert Wade The theme of conference was 'Lift Every Voice', based on the first stanza of the hymn 'Lift Every Voice and Sing' as printed above. It is the African American National Anthem; a hymn of thanksgiving to God for liberation from slavery and a celebration of freedom.

Based on that hymn stanza, the conference highlighted the broader implications of liberation, particularly within the context of Asian churches and ministries and for any settings for that matter. The general theme is sub-dived into three sub-themes as Professor Rajashekar put it:

- 1. Voices of creation crying for liberation. This sub-theme focuses on creation and eco-justice. The future of our planet is in peril due to the exploitation of its resources, resulting in environmental degradation, ecological disasters, and climate change, which affect the lives of millions of people. ALIC seeks to explore the implications of eco-justice for the church's mission and ministries and the stewardship of God's gift of creation.
- 2. Voices of the suffering and crucified people longing for liberation. This sub-theme focuses on people who experience abuse, discrimination, and marginalization. Millions of people in our world are suffering on account of war, violence, displacement, food insecurity, migration, poverty, and economic injustice. How will the Asian church and congregations advocate liberating justice for the forgotten people of our world?
- 3. Voices of unity and discord in the Christian Community. This sub-theme will explore division, conflict, and polarization within the Christian church regarding the full participation of all God's people. The church, as a community of saints and sinners, is not free from the evils and prejudices of our world. Yet, the church's calling is to proclaim the gospel of God's love and acceptance of all people, irrespective of race, caste, sex, gender, disability, political or ideological orientation. Will the Asian churches and congregations dare to follow God's commandment to love one another?

Of course, this theme applies not only to Asian churches and congregations, but also to all churches and congregations both in Asia, North America and everywhere else. We lift our voices for the sake of God's creations, for our peace and unity throughout the world.

For those of you who would like to hear more about my trip, I am planning to do a presentation at church on Thursday, February 6 at 7:00pm.

#### **Kathie Armstrong**



Kathie Armstrong started playing the cello in fifth grade, but she never owned her own instrument until her husband surprised her one Christmas. Today, our congregation gets to enjoy Kathie's gift every second and fourth Sunday at Celebration Service.

Cello isn't the only musical talent Kathie shares with us. A longtime member of Christ Lutheran, she also lends her voice to the beautiful hymns and anthems that float down from the loft when the choir is in full "sing."

But for many years, Kathie has shared a quieter gift. Without any fanfare, she has been making quilts for the Lutheran World Relief organization, first with the Wednesday Women's Circle and now with the Tuesday Morning Friends. The Friends meet weekly at 9:30am to sew, knit and visit.

"Pastor Bimen will often stop by to say hello, and when my daughter, Beth, worked in the office, she'd come and chat for a minute. It's a chance to enjoy each other's company and do some small good."

Small isn't exactly the word for it. The quilts Kathie makes are 60 x 80 inches, each with 48 10-inch squares. In 2024, Kathie made, packaged, and sent 37 large quilts to Lutheran World Relief. She made 38 quilts in 2023.

"It's something I really enjoy," Kathie says. "And if we all just do a little bit, together we can do so much."

If you'd like to do something for the Tuesday Friends, they're always looking for fabric. "It takes two types of fabric for each quilt," Kathie explains. "Flat sheets in any color work great. And I'm ready to start on a bunch of new quilts!"

#### **Shirley Williamson**



"Keep me busy or keep me out of trouble," Shirley Williamson says. "That's one of the things I love about our church — there really isn't much you *can't* do."

Fortunately for us, Shirley finds lots of things to keep her busy at Christ Lutheran. A member since 1970, she's always been involved in Bible study, women's groups and service projects. She's taught Sunday School and VBS, served on Church

Council and Worship Committee, and counted money.

She also sings and makes quilts for nursing homes. Shirley's crystal-clear soprano voice can be heard almost every Sunday, alternating between senior choir and the celebration band. And on Tuesday mornings, you'll find her quilting with friends at the church, making blankets that are given away to people who need a little warmth in their life.

There's a practicality to all this activity. "I make myself clean the house and then reward myself with sewing," she explains with a laugh. Then she adds, "I love to learn, and I love the fellowship. It's amazing to me what I've learned over the years." Both Shirley and our other Faithful Servant this month, Kathie Armstrong, single out Lou Bemiller as an early source of sewing inspiration and guidance.

As for singing, she says, "I could be dog-tired, but I always come home from choir practice feeling rejuvenated." Happy to try something new, Shirley was a proponent of having a contemporary service to appeal to a younger crowd, which meant learning new hymns. "They'll never get to be old favorites if we don't play them," she points out — practically.

"I've always been part of a church choir. It's a big part of my life," Shirley says. We're thankful Shirley has played such a big part in the life of our church and community.


