Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing." (Joel 2:12-13)

Grace and peace to you my brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are now descending from the 'Mount of Transfiguration' of our Transfiguration Sunday and entering into the season of Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday. On Ash Wednesday, we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter with a day of fasting and repentance. Marking our foreheads with dust, we acknowledge our mortality that indeed we are dust and to dust we shall return.

Since the eleventh century, the ashes, made by burning last year's palms, cycle around from the triumphant celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem to the humiliation of sinners covering their heads with the burnt greens. Many churches are still doing it, including our church. As a matter of fact, last Sunday we had a group of people who burned our last year palms and will use the ashes for our Ash Wednesday.

In the Roman world, some slave owners put their names or symbols on the slaves' foreheads. These markings sometimes were used to hide the slaves' true origin and replace them with the name or symbol of the new owner. Therefore sign of the cross on our forehead reminds us that we belong to Christ who died on the cross for our sin.

Also during our baptism, an indelible cross was drawn on our forehead followed by these words, "Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked by the cross of Christ forever."

The word Lent also related to the Latin word 'quadragesima' which means 'forty' referring to the forty days of time Jesus spent in the wilderness to be tempted by the devil (Luke 6:1-13) and forty years of the children of Israel spent in the wilderness (Numbers 14:34). In our church tradition, we spend forty days of Lent focusing on repentance, fasting and almsgiving. Sometimes people refrain from eating or drinking certain foods, so that they can devote their time more in in prayer and meditating on the Word of God.

For our church this year, we chose the theme 'STICS' (Stepping Together In Christian Service). The idea came from our new Mission Statement, "Walking With Christ, We Love and Serve Our Church and Neighbor." Led by Barbara Hester, six of us; Barbara Hester, Pam Ballinger, Sarah Pryor, Mike and Jean Barney and myself have been meeting for the last several months and making our own stick and decorating them with our own stories of faith. Each of us will present our stick and faith story on each Midweek Lent service throughout Lent in place of the homily.

So, sisters and brothers, I invite you all to join me in this Lent journey to focus on our spiritual renewal through prayer, mediation, repentance and service. I invite you also to our midweek service to hear the faith journeys of our sisters and brothers through the STICS.

I'm a Lutheran Hannah Limbong

Christ Lutheran Church, Jeffersontown, Ky.

Junior, University of Louisville (Ky.); public health major; honors student

I've been involved at Christ Lutheran in a variety of capacities. Today I play violin with the church band and co-lead an intergenerational Sunday school class called LIFT (Living in Faith Together). It's important to me to be part of a faith community where we can be encouraged and supported throughout different seasons of life. I enjoy putting my faith into action in an intentional way.

I am incredibly blessed to be part of the Brown Fellows Program at the University of Louisville. [This] is a full-ride scholarship and mentorship program that also gives recipients an opportunity to design two enrichment programs. My first project explored the differences in how the U.S. and U.K. approach health care and public health. I conducted interviews with U.S. public health and health adjacent leaders, traveled to England for an immersive health history course, and interviewed health care professionals and nonprofits to uncover lessons from both systems.

I was certain my path would be in medicine, working directly to improve people's health. But after nearly two years of diving into coursework and [career] shadowing, I realized medicine didn't have my heart—at least not right now. While my commitment to improving community health remains, I'm more drawn to tackling social determinants of health through policy. ... My ultimate goal is to identify where my gifts align with the greatest needs. I'm particularly passionate about improving access to health care and health education through advocacy, policymaking and policy analysis.

Participating in the ELCA Young Adult Climate Advocacy program has been inspiring and empowering. It's been a privilege to connect with so many incredible leaders who are making a real difference in their communities. In 2018, I attended the ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston. A youth leader there shared about her experience at the ELCA Youth Leadership Summit, and her story moved me deeply. When I learned they were looking for a youth leader from Kentucky, I immediately expressed my interest. Later that year, I attended the summit in Nebraska. I met incredible people, made new friends and learned about ELCA advocacy groups. For the first time, I saw the impact of the church's work in the world.

After the event, I applied to the Youth Core Leadership Team that plans the summit. I was one of the 12 selected, and I served for two years. I've grown so much as a servant leader and have come to faith on my own outside of being a pastor's kid.

Being a member of the Mass Gathering Team for the 2024 Youth Gathering felt surreal—a dream come true. The 2018 Gathering was a pivotal stepping stone in my walk with Jesus. To now experience it from behind the scenes was a full-circle moment and one of the coolest experiences of my life.

Serving as a young adult representative, voting member and Reference and Counsel Committee member for the Indiana-Kentucky Synod at the 2022 Churchwide Assembly gave me incredible insights and a glimpse of how God works in and through the church.

I pray for those who are wrestling with their faith and or feel far from the Lord—whether they're just beginning their journey or have grown up in the faith. Even in moments of feeling distant, I pray that they are reminded that God is near, even when we don't feel it.

I'm a Lutheran because I couldn't imagine doing life without God at the center of my life. †
