Mike & Jean Barney



When you sit down with Jean and Mike Barney, you're probably going to hear some interesting stories.

They moved to Louisville in 2008 from California (having lived on a sailboat for six years) to be closer to their daughter, who had just adopted a child from Kazakhstan. Later, they welcomed a granddaughter from Ethiopia. Their other daughter lives in Kansas with her husband and two grown sons.

The Barneys joined CLC in 2009. "We tried some other churches," Mike says, "but when we came here, it was like family."

Obviously, music plays a big part in the Barneys' life. Having sung in choirs back in Sacramento, Jean and Mike sing alto and bass respectively in our senior choir. Mike plays electric bass in the celebration band and also performs around town with several groups. In addition to bass, he plays guitar, mandolin, keyboards, and dabbles in percussion. Jean is his dedicated roadie.

You'll often see Jean serving as Communion Assistant and there's no mistaking Mike's voice when he reads as Lector. Both have worked on Vacation Bible School in past years, and both are on the Property Committee (you can thank them for our emergency lights and fresh air filters.)

Once, when Mike was changing a filter in Room 5, there was a battery short and his arm hair caught on fire, earning him the nickname Sparky. Another time, Mike and Jean were helping with the church landscaping. As Mike edged the front of the church, he ran into an underground nest of hornets. "I dropped that weed whacker and those hornets went after it like it was alive."


Just recently, Jean and Mike learned it would take two years for the manufacturer to repair our historical sign, which was damaged in a car accident. They took it upon themselves to have it fixed locally — in about four days. "We're really proud of our church," Mike says, "and we wanted to show it." As the Barneys celebrate their 57th wedding anniversary, they remember when they met in high school back in California. "She sat behind me in geometry," Mike recalls. "I borrowed everything I could from her — paper, pencils, protractors, you name it. And I never gave it back." Until their 34th anniversary, when Mike actually gave all those items back to Jean.

A conversation with Mike and Jean might turn to Mike's service in the Navy as a translator (he speaks Chinese, among other languages, and served in Vietnam Nam, Okinawa, and NSA), or the books they're reading together (currently a biography of John Wayne), or their life at sea. But ultimately, the conversation always returns to family, which includes their CLC family. Both are clearly dear to them.

So, the next time you see Mike and Jean, ask them what they're up to. And get ready for a good story.
