"The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him." (Luke 8:38-39)

As the followers of Christ, we are called to share the good news of Jesus. We don't need to wait for someone else to do it. We are the harbingers of the good news of God. As God said through the prophet Isaiah, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?..." (Isaiah 43:19)

We are called to come and see what God is doing all around us. We just need to open our eyes and our hearts to see and perceive them. Francis Bacon, a prominent early advocate of observation-based scientific method, recognized that God has written two books: Scripture (God's Word) and the book of nature (God's Works). We have a group of people who have been making cards to be sent to our folks especially the sick, hospitalized and the homebound members. Tuesday group makes blankets that we send to people here at home or overseas. Our Wednesday group comes every week to take care of our landscape and building. Our caring ministry group prepares meals for members who are sick or in recovery. Others involved in planning and helping with our services, the youth who livestream our services so that those who cannot be here with us in persons can join our service. We partner with JAM to support the needs of our community. We offered generous financial supports to the ELCA Disaster Relief, a struggling congregation in our conference, an ELCA congregation in Somerset damaged by tornado, the victims of flood in my hometown in Sumatra and other disasters. There are countless great things that God is doing in our community and the world in which we are part of that we need to celebrate. The season after Pentecost, is a growing season and a season to see and watch the wonderful thing that God has done and continue to do among us. Come and see, then go and tell. Be the proclaimer of all the great things that God has done and continues to do.



We will need volunteers to man our booth 9/12 - 9/14! Please contact the office to sign up to help in the booth!


