Walk with Jesus

Every day is a walk with Jesus. We Christians believe life is spent in the presence of our Lord. Therefore, we can talk about every day as a day during which we walk with Jesus. Some days we feel Jesus' presence. Some days we feel quite a distance from Jesus. We boldly proclaim that, regardless of how we feel, Jesus is there. Jesus walks with us every day.

For our stewardship campaign theme this year we chose "Walking With Jesus". This theme seems appropriate with our new mission, "Walking With Christ, We Love and Serve our Church and Neighbors." As we who are Christ Lutheran Church consider our stewardship over the next few weeks, you will be asked to think about your use of money, talents, and time as a part of your walk with Jesus. This is most appropriate, because when Jesus walked this earth with his disciples, he often talked about those things.

We believe that everything we have is a trust from God, given to us to care for and manage. What we do with our money, time and talents, is very much a part of our relationship with our Lord. This will be our focus in the coming weeks.

For three consecutive Sundays beginning on Sunday November 2nd, we will read a bulletin insert and hear a talk in worship. For three weeks, we will each receive a letter from the congregation. All of these will focus on our walk with Jesus, and how money, time and talents play an important part in this walk.

Then, on Sunday, November 23, each member of Christ Lutheran will have the opportunity to complete an estimate of giving card. On this card, each of us will indicate our plan for giving for the coming year. This will not only be a plan for giving to Christ Lutheran Church, it will also be a plan for how we will walk with Jesus in the coming year.

10 Stewardship

- Respond gratefully to what God has first given us. All that we do is a response to God's grace. Everything we are, have, and use comes from God. Best of all, God gives the gift of Jesus .Christ and the community of believers. It all begins with God. Our confession of faith in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior is not of our doing. Grateful stewards put God first.
- Obey responsibly to glorify God as a faithful proclamation of God's word. We acknowledge our faith and show our faith in the gospel for the glory of God and for the building up of the body of Christ. This takes courage. It involves our life-long obedience, including the ways we treat our families, others, and ourselves.
- Sacrifice proportionately as Christ sacrificed for us. For our sake Jesus gave up everything to make us rich through the cross and the resurrection. We are called to sacrifice so others may share in God's word and blessings.
- 4. Give willingly as moved by the Holy Spirit. We have been prepared to give ourselves. We give our time, talents and resources freely.
- Share abundantly as we have received. The purpose of these gifts is for the good of the community of God. We give to build up the body of Christ. We use and share our gifts for the benefit of all.
- Give proportionately is our way of giving in relation to our abundance.We are to give according to our "means," not according to an income or a budget.
- 7. Commit intentionally means making a statement about your intent and following through. As members in the body of Christ, we are asked to make a commitment of our time, talents, and resources as a faithful response to God and as a statement of support for God's work.
- 8. Contribute regularly means practicing our stewardship on a daily basis. By doing so this becomes a lifestyle.
- 9. Live genuinely means putting your faith into action. This is the tangible demonstration of what is sincerely on our hearts and where our treasure is, not simply a verbal expression.
- 10. Accept a challenge means recognizing the dynamic nature of our faith. As our faith grows so will our blessings, and our responsibilities.


